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DENLIS

DENLIS is a cool season variety in the Adventure/Brittany time slot with a 14-16 week maturity. DENLIS produces smooth, white, well wrapped curds on a strong upright plant. The tall frame sits well off the ground, and offers excellent curd cover.



BORIS

BORIS is a versatile and self-covering cauliflower with 11-12 weeks maturity for spring, mild summer and autumn harvest. BORIS has a medium to large frame offering good curd cover, with dome-shaped heads and excellent curd colour and quality.



SHAKARIS

High Resistance: Xcc

SHAKARIS is an early maturing (80-85 days) autumn variety with a medium to large frame and heavy, smooth white curds. The domed heads are well covered and very uniform in maturity. SHAKARIS has shown very good tolerance to disease in plantings to date and has intermediate resistance to Black Rot (Xcc).



FALKIS

FALKIS is an exceptional shoulder season variety in south-eastern Australia, and can also be utilised for harvest north of Perth during winter and south of Perth during spring. FALKIS has a strong internal wrap with very uniform dome heads and smooth, heavy white curds. It has a medium, upright frame with a 90-95 day maturity.



OMERIS

OMERIS is a cool season variety mainly suited to southern areas for winter and early spring production. OMERIS is slow maturing; around 16 weeks from transplant and produces well wrapped heavy white curds with a domed shape and nice tuck. OMERIS' frame is upright and vigorous, and this variety has shown excellent uniformity in size and maturity in plantings to date.
